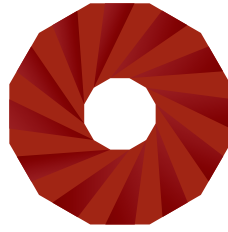
KINGSLEY SCHMIDTKE | *Facilities Manager*
